- Note: (The brief guidelines given below are only indicative. For detail, the corresponding orders/notifications issued from time to time must be referred).
1. Minimum passing marks: In each Theory Paper 30% in Final Examinations and 40% in aggregate i.e. total of Term Test and Final Examination. Similarly in Practical and sessional 30% in each component separately and 40% in aggregate of both components taken together.
 2. Passing in Discipline and Extra-curricular activities is not necessary but marks obtained therein will be counted in total marks/percentage obtained.
 3. Star (*) shown against the marks denotes fail in that paper and "G" denotes grace marks awarded in that paper to pass the examination. However, the grace marks are virtual marks which are neither to be added in individual component/subject nor in total/aggregate marks obtained. The grace marks will be awarded only if, the student appears in all papers prescribed for the examination.
 4. Grace Marks to the extent of 1% of the aggregate marks prescribed for an examination (to be raised to the next whole number) will be awarded to a student in the failed subject(s) provided the student passes the examination by the award of such Grace Marks.
 5. Promotion: A student may be promoted to the higher class only if he/she has passed at least 25% of the theory papers and 25% of the practical and sessional subjects, separately.
 6. Re-valuation of answer book shall be permissible in not more than 25% of the theory papers (to be raised to the next whole number) in which a student is actually appeared in examination. For Re-valuation, the student must submit his/her application form (through Head of the institute) to the University within 15 days from the date of issue of marks sheet. Incomplete application form without requisite fee or received after the due date will be rejected. Re-valuation is not permitted in Back paper examinations.
 7. For any kind of improvement as per rules, the student has to apply within one month to their institute from the declaration of the result.
 8. Term Test: A student allowed to improve the term tests if he/she is appearing in the University Examination of that theory paper again and if failed earlier. If a student has applied for improvement of term test marks, the marks secured by him/her in previous term test shall stand automatically cancelled. The marks of the latest examinations/test shall only be considered for working out the result. If such a candidate fails to appear in the test, he/she shall be treated as absent.
 9. Sessional Improvement: If any student fails in any practical and/or sessional subject(s), he/she can apply for improvement in the sessional component provided the earlier marks in the sessional component are less than 40%. Such student will be required to register in both practical and sessional components for the subject(s) and his/her marks of the latest practical & sessional examination shall only be considered for working out the result. If such a student fails to appear in the test, then he/she shall be treated as absent.
 10. A candidate shall be awarded:
 - (i) Honours, if he/she secures at least 70% of the aggregate i.e. 4900 marks or above. (4200 marks or above in case of Diploma Candidate.)
 - (ii) First class, if he/she secures at least 60% of the aggregate i.e. 4200 to 4899. (3600 marks to 4199 in case of Diploma Candidate.)
 - (iii) Second class, if he/she secures at least 50% of the aggregate i.e. 3500 to 4199. (3000 marks to 3599 in case of Diploma Candidate.)
 - (iv) Pass class- below 3500 marks. (3000 in case of Diploma Candidate.) Subject to fulfillment of condition at point no.1.
 11. Answer books are not subjected to any inspection or production before any external or internal agency except at the instance of Vice-Chancellor.
 12. In case of any mistake detected in the mark-sheet afterwards the University is fully empowered to correct the same.
 13. All court cases shall be subjected to the jurisdiction of Rajasthan Technical University headquarter i.e. KOTA and not any other place.
